THE ALLIANCE THEATRE BECOMES NEW HOME FOR GEORGIA'S POETRY OUT LOUD COMPETITION

NATIONAL PROGRAM EXPOSES THOUSANDS OF HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS TO POETRY

ATLANTA, October 5, 2022 — The Alliance Theatre is pleased to announce a new partnership with the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), Poetry Foundation, and Georgia Council for the Arts (GCA). The partnership results in the Alliance becoming the new home for Poetry Out Loud in the state of Georgia.

A national program co-sponsored by the NEA and the Poetry Foundation, Poetry Out Loud encourages high school students to learn about poetry through memorization and recitation of the written word. The Alliance will coordinate the program with schools across the state before hosting the Atlanta regional semi-finals and state finals at the Alliance Theatre.

"The Alliance is honored to partner with the NEA, Poetry Foundation, and Georgia Council for the Arts. For over two decades, the Alliance has used theatre as a tool for teens to find their voice and share it powerfully," says Dan Reardon Director of Education and Associate Artistic Director Christopher Moses. "This new initiative allows us to scale that work statewide, encouraging teens to embrace poetry, proclaim it loudly, and perform it with an artful confidence that promises to inspire. We can't wait!"

Started in 2005 as a pilot program in Chicago and Washington, D.C., Poetry Out Loud has grown to involve millions of students from across the country. In 2022, more than 6,000 students participated in the competition, representing nearly 40 counties and over 300 educators in Georgia. The Alliance takes over coordination of the state's program after 14 years of coordination by the Atlanta History Center.

"Poetry Out Loud encourages students to practice lifelong skills that can help them in any future career. They can explore creative expression, learn how to see other people's perspectives, and be more confident public speakers," said Executive Director of Georgia Council for the Arts Tina Lilly. "The Alliance has been a part of Georgia's arts community for decades, and we're excited to partner with them for this program!"

What is Poetry Out Loud?

Presented by the National Endowment for the Arts and the Poetry Foundation, Poetry Out Loud is a national arts education program that encourages the study of great poetry by offering free educational materials and a dynamic recitation competition for high school students across the country.

The program:

- Introduces students to classic and contemporary poetry
- Encourages students to learn about literary history and contemporary life
- Helps students master public speaking skills and build self-confidence

 - North Georgia: February 2023 (details to be announced)
 - South Georgia: February 2023 (details to be announced)
 - Virtual Option: February 2023 (details to be announced)
- State Finals: Tuesday, March 14, 2023, at the Alliance Theatre
- National Finals: to be held May 8-10, 2023, in Washington, DC (details to be announced)
