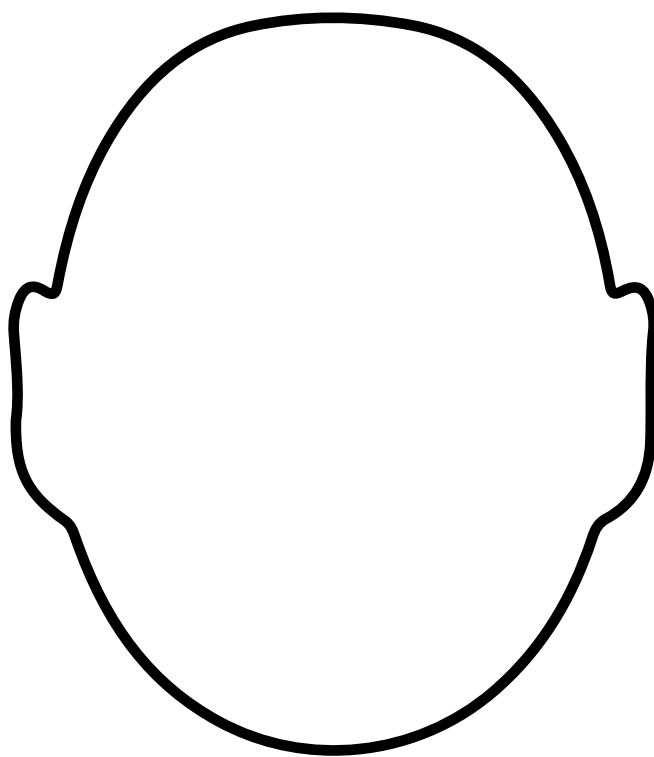

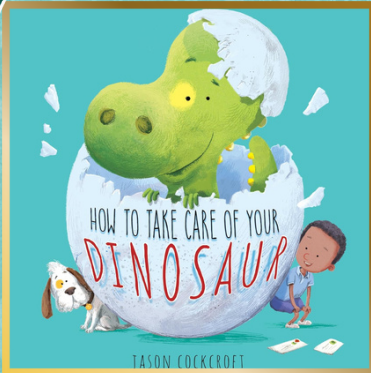
Design your Dinner Plate

Did you know artists called “Modlers or Pattern Designers” create the patterns on the plates we eat from? Imagine you’re a designer and create an original pattern for your table setting.

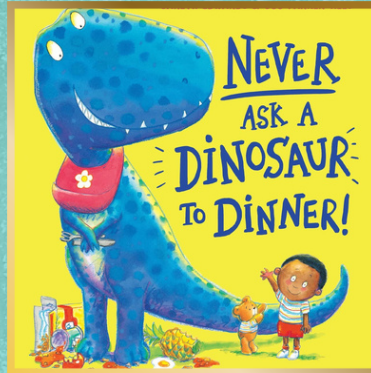

DINOSAUR!

Feed the Dinosaur - Dinner Plate

Materials:

- Paper plate
- Tissue Paper or Scrap paper
- Markers/Crayons
- Glue Stick or Liquid Glue
- Extras: stickers, tin foil, chenille stems



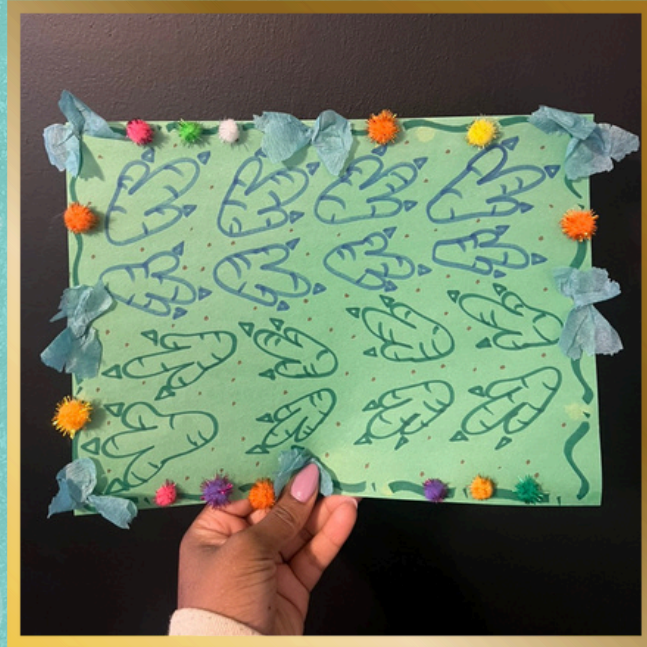
1. Using the materials, draw/glue/sculpt food your imaginary dinosaur would eat.
2. Give the edge of the plate a pleasing pattern with stripes, dots, or an original design.
3. Set a place at the dinner table for your dinosaur.
4. Describe your dinosaur menu, and model how your dinosaur might eat the food using your hand or toy.

DINOSAUR!

Prehistoric Placemat

Materials:

- Paper
- Markers/Crayons
- Optional: Glue Stick or Liquid Glue
- Extras: stickers, pom poms, tissue paper, ribbons



1. Decorate your paper using crayons, markers or stickers. Be sure to add nature details like trees or leaves (or rocks!) to make your dinosaur feel at home.

2. Optional: Add an outline of the plate, fork, and spoon or knife to help with setting the table.



3. Add the placemat under the dinner plate and get ready for a culinary adventure!

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DIY Shadow Theatre



1. Hang or drape a light-colored sheet, or simply find a blank wall.
2. Turn off as many lights as you are comfortable. Point a bright light, like a phone flashlight or reading lamp, toward the blank wall/sheet.
3. Using your hand or cut paper, block the light from hitting the wall/sheet. This casts a shadow!
4. Experiment with getting closer and farther from the light. Does your shadow grow? Does the shadow shrink? Is it clear, or kind of wobbly?
